The 2nd edition of the Virtual Alumni Meet was held on Sunday 24th April, 2022 at 10.30 am. 915 alumni registered for the event.



Voice of Alumni

People and places evoke memories - and those recollections are hard to miss when your college prominently features in movies so frequently. It just takes you back to a trip down memory lane. For many of the people in my batch, those memories take us through two campuses, one in Hindustan and the other in KCG or National Institute of Technology and Science (NITS) as we were known back then. At that time, we had a different identity; we were NITS until the government went into rebranding to convert all Regional Engineering

Colleges(REC) to NIT. So for us old-timers, it is still a bit of cognitive dissonance to switch between NITS and KCG Tech when speaking of our alma mater. Our college was a start-up with a promise purely because of the pedigree. We borrowed the identity and the campus from Hindustan as its sister concern in the initial two years, but we were able to step out of the shadows far sooner.

I still remember the day the college campus was officially inaugurated; the festivities surrounding that day are still vivid in my memories. We had the best and the newest facilities, and the iconic clock tower still evokes the freshness I felt on that day. While facilities were one of the most important reasons why the college continues to be popular, there are two other reasons why our college continues to scale new heights. First is the college administration's investment in dedicated teachers, and second is an "open" culture that still stands as the college's hallmark. We were fortunate to have some outstanding and committed teachers, to begin with - Dharmalingam sir, Udupa sir, Sumathi ma'am, Bindu ma'am, and others. Our present principal - Deiva Sundari ma'am- was there in 1999, standing testimony to how the investments from the administration were instrumental in defining the college and student identity. And finally, the culture - I firmly believe that an academic environment is likely to foster far better results when there is freedom of expression, and the college treats the students like responsible citizens. This open culture continues to distinguish us from other colleges, which is the biggest reason why it continues to glue us to the college's identity. We still remember the college fondly because the college administration focused on a right mix of strong academic outlook, fun elements, and an emphasis on ethics. I have been a student at IIT and the University of Maryland, and I can definitely say that sense of pride I get as a student of KCG tech is definitely up there. But, while all these are important, the relationships you form through college are the most significant glue that binds you to the college forever. Friends are an essential component of your college life. The friendships formed in these years are likely to last your lifetime.

Our batch will always be special because we were the first, and yes, we continue to hold our batch spirits high whenever and wherever we meet. The batch spread across four disciplines has done pretty well for itself and has been quite successful on the career front. History is vital to understanding the college life our batch enjoyed. There was only one large IT company - Polaris in Old Mahabalipuram Road when we started college on the Hindustan campus. Tidel park construction began a year after in 1999. When we graduated college, TCS had revenue in millions, not billions. We were part of the batch which graduated with a lot of uncertainty in terms of options. We did not have any placements at that time. Those were

the years when getting a job was not a certainty. College placements were restricted to around a dozen colleges across TamilNadu. The batch struggled initially, but within a year or two, most of us were lucky to ride the second wave of the IT boom. And two decades later, now when I see career placements in the high 90s, it brings a huge smile. While this is hugely satisfying, I would also like the students to reflect on what having a career might mean.

I live by the adage - "You live your life once", so no passion is small; no goal needs to be given up just because it might take time. And yes, the biggest philosophy that I espouse is that you don't have to stick to a single career goal in your life. I have had three different careers, each facilitated by an academic degree. I started my career as a software engineer writing code (which I hated, to begin with), as I always imagined a career as a chip designer while I was in college. I did apply to US universities when I was in college. I had admissions from some really good universities. But unfortunately, my visa was rejected, and my American dreams went kaput. So instead of designing chips, I was writing code. I was hell-bent on ensuring that I wanted a career that would require no coding from my end. Hence I did a Ctrl+Alt+Del to reboot. I finished my MBA and moved to a career with no coding. I had a successful professional life doing business development, program management, and account management for large IT consulting companies. After eight years, corporate life did not entice me further, and thus I decided to reboot my career again. I finished my PhD and am now working as a business school professor. I teach business analytics to undergrads and MBA students, and lo and behold, apart from the concepts, I teach coding, which will help the students to make datadriven business decisions. And yes, the reboots don't stop here; I have two more career reboots planned for the next few decades. If you notice, the constant theme is all about reboot accomplished through learning.

Here is my advice to the present students at our college - Allow yourself reboots from time to time, and don't let constraints rule your life. It is always best to have multiple plans when setting out any major life goals. While some parts of the goals may work out but it is most likely that you may have to look for alternatives. Don't get caught up in building a monolithic career earlier in your life. Let those thoughts not be ossified, and seek out people with contrarian views. Find a good mentor or set of mentors who are invested in your well-being and willing to spend time with you to shape your thoughts and perspectives.
