





### Report on the visit to Madras Dyslexia Association (MDA)

July 16<sup>th</sup>, 2018: A team of 7 students from the ECE department visited Madras Dyslexia Association, accompanied by Dr. V Thulasi Bai, HOD/ECE and Ms. B Thyla, Assistant professor/ECE. The team took their learning kit for dyslexia to interact with the staff of MDA and to carry out a clinical trial with the students there.

MDA is a non-profit organisation founded by concerned parents and empathetic educationist in 1992.MDA has been providing remedial help and support to children with dyslexia, training their parents to help children with their difficulties, as well as spreading awareness to the community at large, helping schools set up resource rooms and conducting teacher training programs.

The teachers at MDA were extremely pleased with the kit that we had created to improve the dyslexic condition of children, "Lexi Check". This kit helps in improving the spelling ability of a child by using a multisensory approach. They appreciated us for our innovative approach to help these children. They also gave us several suggestions for the upgraded model of the kit.

The Children have various modules to learn from at MDA. These modules determine the difficulty level of the lesson. The teachers asked us to link the kit with a data base so that they can choose the modules for everyday learning of the child. They also asked us to incorporate encouraging clap sounds and bonus points at the end of each successful learning experience of the child.

Overall, the kit seemed to serve the wholesome learning purpose. We had two children take part in the clinical trial and this gave us a lot of insight and areas to work on. The Children were extremely enthusiastic and learnt with great passion. It was delightful to see our project actually benefiting young children. We hope to implement the changes as soon as possible. We thank our staff and management for their support in all our endeavours.
