

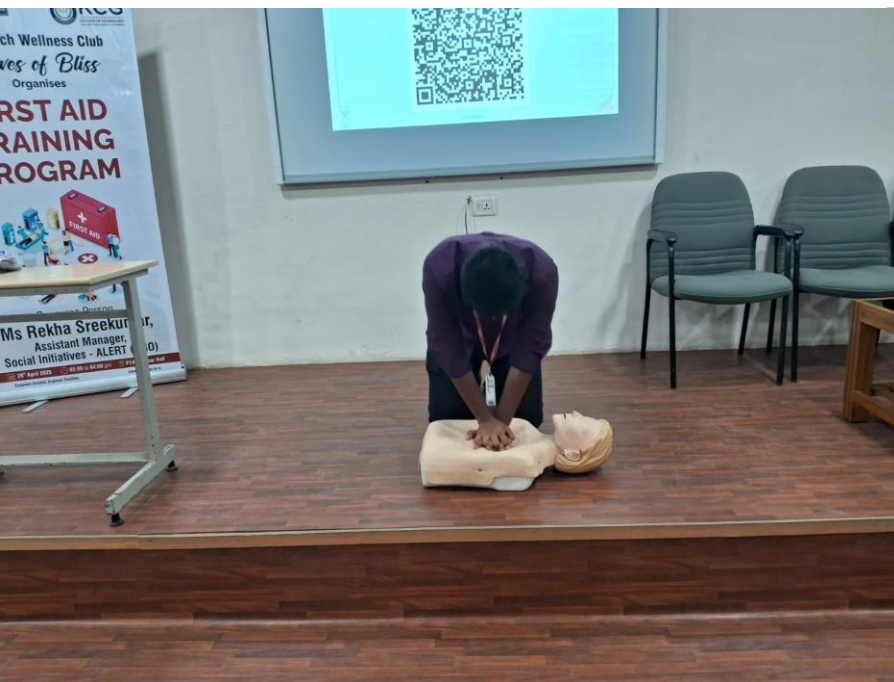

1. Awareness session on First Aid Training

4.ALERT VoICE - Two-Day Intensive First Aid Training program

The **ALERT Golden Army KCG Tech Club** conducted a Two-Day Intensive First Aid Training program – VoICE (Volunteer In Case of Emergency) on 8th & 9th January, 2026 @ F14 between 9 am to 4 pm. 42 NCC, NSS, and first-year students underwent the intensive training program. The training focused on developing emergency response skills.

Day 1: Students were introduced to basic first aid techniques such as wound care, bleeding control, burns, fractures, and emergency assessment through interactive sessions.

Day 2 : It was focused on hands-on training, including CPR, choking management, and mock drills, making the sessions engaging and practical.

The training was informative, interactive, and highly beneficial, equipping students with essential life-saving skills and confidence.

Further the students will be assessed by the doctors of Appollo Hospital, and will be graduated as a First Aid Volunteer.
